- 3. Emeriti Nominations were submitted from both last year and this year. They include Dr. Thomas Baucom, A&S, Dr. Rita Boyston, CEPS, Dr. Frank Fuller, CBA, Mr. Floyd Kirby, CBA, Dr. Judy McCrary, CEPS, Dr. Wayne Claeren, A&S, Dr. Rodney Friery, A&S. All were approved. Emeriti are honored at the December graduation.
- 4. Modification to Liberal Studies Program was proposed by Dr. Wade. The program will be 120 semester hours a reduction of 8 semester hours. He said we needed the program to be competitive online. The program is different from the current Liberal Studies because it does not require all A&S classes so it will have a broader application. Dr. Gordon Harvey is the adviser for the program.
- 5. Dr. Turner and Dr. Simmons told the council about the General Education Learning Outcomes. They will establish a pathway to reaffirmation by SACS. A working group will be established with support from Dr. Simmons and Dr. Turner.
- 6. A power point hand out on Assessment was provided. The handout will help educate all the departments across campus and was already piloted by Dr. Wade with the A&S dept heads.
